

Swimmers Success at Regionals

Jack Hunt recently had seven swimmers attend the British Gas East Region Championship at the UEA.



Katie Brown (Year 7) was the most successful of the swimmers; she won six Gold Medals in

the 200 Free, 400 Free, 100 Fly, 200 Fly, 200 IM and 400 IM. She won Bronze Medals in the 100 Free, 200 Back, 4 x 100 Medley Relay and 4 x 200 Free Relay. Katie was awarded the BAGCAT Award for being top 12 year old girl in the Region.

Dan Brown (Year 9) won a Gold Medal in the 1500 Free, Silver in the 200 Fly and 4 x 200 Free Relay, as well as Bronze Medals in the 400 IM, 400 Free, 4 x 100 Free Relay and 4 x 100 Medley Relay.

James (Year 9) and Hannah Newton (Year 7) also swam at UEA, it was Hannah's first year at the regional competition, she competed in seven events, managing to beat her personal best in all her swims and finishing in the top 20 in all her races. James had six qualifying times for the Regional Championships. He qualified for three finals - in the 100 Breastroke, 200 Breastroke and 200 Backstroke, finishing 3rd, 4th and 5th respectively.

Jamie Scholes (Year 7) won Silver in the 100 and 200 Backstroke, Bronze in 1500 Free, 200 and 100 Fly. He also finished 4th in the 12 year age group over all. Dan Leigh (Year 8) achieved three individual Silver Medals, 1 Relay Silver Medal and 2 Relay Bronze Medals. He also came 2nd overall in the 13 year boy's category.

Josh Cassidy (Year 8) qualified for two events and set a personal best in one of the races. This is a fantastic achievement as it was the fourth consecutive year he has competed in a regional competition.

JACK HUNT YEAR 6 OLYMPIC GAMES

Jack Hunt School became the Olympic site for 300 Year 6 pupils from eight Primary Schools. To experience being part of an Olympic event, each school bought teams to compete in Cycling, Gymnastics, Handball, Athletics and Rowing. Year 12 Level 2 Sports Leaders organised the practice and the competitions. Highlees won the Gold Medal in Handball, Longthorpe won the Cycling, Ravensthorpe won the Gymnastics, Thorpe won the Rowing and West Town won the Athletics. The overall results were: Bronze Medal - Sacred Heart, Silver Medal - jointly won by Longthorpe and Gladstone and the Gold Medal - Highlees.
