### Take Over Day 2015

Once again our Annual Take Over Day which took place in early February was a great success!

This year had a large number of applications for almost 70 positions including Headteachers, Deputy & Assistant Headteachers, Heads of House, Curriculum Area Leaders, Laboratory Technician, Catering Staff and IT Network Manager. The successful students spent the day shadowing members of staff enabling them to gain a real insight into the running of a large Secondary School or Primary School and get to see what really happens behind the scenes.

The students who worked at the Primary Schools got involved with 1:1 reading, helping small groups with literacy and numeracy exercises as well as helping with teaching lessons and school assemblies.

'Take Over' positions were also available at Peterborough Hospital and Anglian Water. Year 12 students were given the opportunity to shadow roles in various departments at the Hospital including Nursing, Physiotherapy, Midwifery and Biomedical Science. One student, Eiman Arshad was given the opportunity to shadow a doctor for the day including experiencing an operation.

Assistant Headteacher, Chris Game said, *"This is a fantastic opportunity for students to experience work placements to develop their knowledge and understanding of the work environment and their chosen placement. We were delighted with the increased number of applications from last year and our students were very excited to be taking part. We are extremely thankful to our local partners who continue to support our Take Over Day offering a wide variety of opportunities to our students"*.

The students who shadowed the Senior Leadership Team at Jack Hunt were also given an opportunity at the end of the day to give feedback on the roles they shadowed and any recommendations they had on improving some of the work they had experienced.

Once again, the students that took part found the experience very beneficial and enjoyable and are looking forward to applying again next year.

### Barcelona 2015

This year's KS3 trip to Barcelona was a resounding success as well as an experience to remember for students and the accompanying teachers. In the early hours of Tuesday 3 March, 49 Year 8/Year 9 students and five teachers (Mr Keber, Dr Stopp, Mr Barrick, Mr Latorre and myself), all sleepy yet excited, set off to Gatwick airport to board our BA flight to Barcelona. After a long and gruelling day, we arrived at the youth hostel and, once all rooms were allocated, we joyfully went for a deserved rest on the beach.

On the next day, we went strolling through the old part of the city. Despite the heavy rain, our students enjoyed discovering the famous "Barrio Gótico", the "Plaza Catalunya" and "Las Ramblas". This was also the perfect opportunity for the students to practise their Spanish speaking skills as, after a visit to the 'Museo de Historia de Barcelona', they were left to shop around.

After lunch and another visit to the beach, Thursday was spent visiting the amazing "Sagrada Familia" Cathedral, designed by Gaudí. Barcelona's world famous landmark will be finished by 2026, nearly 150 years after work began in 1882. Gaudí transformed it with his architectural and engineering style, combining Gothic and curvilinear Art Nouveau forms.

On Friday, the students enjoyed an exciting tour of the "Camp Nou" - the home of Barcelona FC. The Tour included the Stadium, the FCB Museum, Messi Space and the Multimedia Centre. From what I could see and hear, the students had a brilliant experience visiting one of the most vibrant cities in the world. They were a pleasure to be with, as they fully embraced the Spanish culture, taking every opportunity to use their Spanish speaking skills. The trip has given them an excellent insight into the Spanish way of life and will undoubtedly prove invaluable to their learning.

David Dein became Vice Chairman of Arsenal FC in 1983 and brought Arsene Wenger to the club in 1996. One of the architects of the Premier League, he has been instrumental in changes to domestic and international football such as the introduction of goal line technology.

David spoke about the growth of the Premier League brand and the desire to become the best in the world. He likened this to the importance of students becoming the best version of themselves they can be, taking pride in everything they do. He demonstrated the importance of teamwork in life. He was very well received by students sharing many stories, answering questions and telling jokes. He left students advising them they should live life like a turtle saying **"you don't get anywhere without being brave enough to stick your neck out!"**

"It will be the second time I will be spending time in Parliament," she continued "as I was lucky enough to do my work experience working with local MP Stewart Jackson and even visited No 10 Downing Street. I am hoping to study Politics and Quantitative Research Studies at University so this is a fantastic opportunity for me."*

Georgina has already had a few meetings with local MP Stewart Jackson before she attends a residential course in April where she will meet the other Youth MPs from all over the UK.

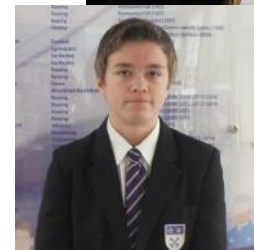
## Year 11 Student Commemorates Katharine of Aragon in Spanish

## Students exceed expectations at Annual Global Challenge for Languages

First of all, thank you to all our students who took part in the Global Challenge 2015, one of our most competitive championships to date. I am always amazed by the response to the competition!

The Global Challenge saw a total of 25,393 students competing from 157 schools worldwide. In a multiple record-breaking week of vocabulary learning, almost 12 million questions were answered and over 30 million points scored. The competition was very tight and positions kept changing until the very last minutes of the competition.

In All Languages we finished in 8th position (Challenge Cup - all students' scores included), a significant improvement on our 14th position last time. In the Genius Cup which takes account of only the top 25 scores we finished in 18th position - again a major improvement as last time we did not feature in the top 20 schools.

**French:** 8th position for the Challenge Cup with 254,615 points with 179 students taking part – we were nowhere near the top 20 last time.

16th position for the Genius Cup with 133,630 points. This is the first time the school features on the top 20 leader board for French - beating Oundle School and several grammar schools!

**Spanish:** 75,180 points for the Challenge Cup which was not enough to get onto the top 20 leader board but with Parklands High School at 20 with 78,938 points we weren't far away. Only 92 students took part. 50,610 points in the Genius cup which again (unfortunately) was not enough to get onto the leader board.

**Urdu:** 1st position with 191,590 points! 7 students from Jack Hunt School finished in the top 10! Of course, Urdu has a history of doing extremely well in the competition but this year students have beaten their previous score with a score of 313,320 points (180 Urdu students took part).

Our Top 3 scorers this time have gone well beyond last year's scores (which were already excellent!)

- Jerin Matthews in Year 11 managed to achieve 20,475 points in Spanish (despite being in the middle of mock exams) – against 16,605 points for the top Spanish scorer last year.
- Alex Makoni in Year 9 achieved 20,150 points in French against 11,440 points for last year's French top scorer.
- Sabha Ali in Year 9 achieved 18,060 points in Urdu against 16,725 points for the top Urdu student last year.

What a fantastic achievement! We will be looking forward to taking part in the next competition in September and trying to beat our fantastic scores again!
