#### **New Build Update**

The school site has been a hive of activity since the summer break with Carillion moving in to begin 56 intensive weeks of construction to deliver our fantastic new facilities in time for September 2018. In recent weeks the landscape has been transformed with the construction of the steel frame for our dining hall and English classrooms above, with a 200 tonne crane coming onto site to lift in concrete sections for our floors, stairs and roof.

Conscious of their impact on the environment as members of the Considerate Constructors Scheme, Carillion have been keen to ensure the project is delivered in a sustainable way. During the initial groundworks in August, significant amounts of stone were uncovered below the topsoil and rather than bringing to site crushed stone later in the project for the All Weather Pitch base, Carillion brought in a stone crusher to recycle some of this material. This action alone has reduced the amount of lorry trips to site by over 100 over the course of the project with obvious benefits to the environment and for those residents living alongside routes to and from site.

With a living, breathing construction project operating side by side with the school, Carillion staff and Jack Hunt School staff have been keen to ensure no opportunities are missed on behalf our students and there are plans early in the new year for construction-themed sessions in lessons supported by Carillion's expert staff. In addition members of the project management team have recently been in to school to support the annual book wrapping effort, demonstrating that the spirit of collaboration has extended outside the site fencing and into the school itself.

Regular Progress Meetings are scheduled between the school, the Local Authority, project managers and builders and at the most recent of these assurance was given that the project remains on schedule. The whole school community is extremely excited to see the project enter its next phases and finally deliver us wonderful new facilities in the Summer!

# CONGRATULATIONS!

### **A-Level and GCSE Results**

We are absolutely delighted with our 2017 A Level results which saw our overall pass rate rise to 99%. In addition, 75% of our students achieved A\* - C grades with 41% achieving the top A\*- B grades.

Notable achievements were by Mariyum Khan who achieved 2 A\* grades and 2 A grades and will be studying Nursing; Matija Zivotic who achieved 1 A\* and 2 A grades and will be studying Accounting and Finance at London School of Economics; Thomas Miller who achieved 3 A grades and will be studying Chemistry at Durham; We wish all our students the very best of luck for their future and thank them for the extremely positive contribution they have made to Jack Hunt School and our community.

This is the first year of the new GCSEs in English Language, English Literature and Mathematics, although there have been major changes to the English and Mathematics GCSEs to increase their rigour, Jack Hunt School is delighted that their students have seen improved results overall.

Headteacher, Pamela Kilbey said, "We are absolutely delighted with the results achieved by our students this



year. Despite the much tougher examinations in English and Mathematics we have increased our English and Mathematics combined percentage to achieve a figure of 57%. We are especially proud of the way our students have responded to the increased challenges they faced this year.

The really pleasing results across the school departments, with exceptional performances from Triple Science with 100% A\*-C, Urdu with 95% A\*-C and Maths progress at + 0.40, have contributed to the extremely good progress made by our students from their starting points in Year 7. Yet again, and for the 7th consecutive year, we have progress figures significantly above the national average".



#### **Duke of Edinburgh**

Around 15 students at Jack Hunt School have celebrated their outstanding success in this year's Duke of Edinburgh Award. The students received their Bronze Awards during a Presentation Evening at the Town Hall on Wednesday 29 November 2017, with other schools from across the city.

To gain the award, each of the students completed four sections to demonstrate how they have helped in the community, developed their skills and self-confidence, participated in physical activities and experienced the challenge of teamwork on outdoor expeditions.



Throughout the evening the students were presented with their awards by the Deputy Mayor and Mayoress. Mr O'Connor, Duke of Edinburgh (DofE) Co-ordinator for Bronze says "Visiting the Town Hall is always a lovely evening to share in the success of our students' hard work. We are all very proud of their determination to succeed and complete the award."

#### **Sport Presentation Evening**

Wednesday 22 November 2017 saw our annual Sports Award Evening, held to celebrate a wonderful year of sports. The evening showcased the many achievements of students from Years 4 – 13, across the school and partner Primary schools.

A member of Great Britain's gold-medal winning 4x400m relay team, Richard Buck, joined us for the evening, to help present the awards, and then inspire the students by talking through his experiences about his life and career as an Olympian and International Runner.

He has obtained two British Championship titles and two Grand Championships. His biggest achievement came in October 2016 when he fought his way through various competitions and gained the title of World Champion.

#### **Bebras Challenge**

Between 6 - 10 November 2017, the ICT and Computer students took part in the annual Bebras Computational Thinking Challenge. The competition is aimed at inspiring students to get Involved in

Computer Science, in a fun and active way through brain teaser challenges.

The international competition is held in 30 counties with the top selection of students being invited along to Oxford University to participate in round two. The event itself is split into four sections depending on age covering Years 6-13, with the aim to gain as many points over the 18 challenges.
