Jack Hunt School Presentation Evening



World Champion and Olympic Athlete Derek Redmond presented awards and certificates to students at the annual Presentation Evening at Jack Hunt School on Thursday 5 January 2012.

During Derek's career, he held the British record for the 400m sprint, and won gold medals at the World Championships, European Championships and Commonwealth Games, but

he is best remembered for his performance at the 1992 Olympic Games in Barcelona where he tore his hamstring in the 400m semi-final but fought through the pain and, with assistance from his father, managed to complete a full lap of the track as the crowd gave him a standing ovation.

During the Presentation Evening prizes and trophies were awarded to students, both past and present, for their hard work, commitment and contribution to subjects they have studied and areas of school life. Certificates for GCE A Levels, GCSEs and Vocational Qualifications were also presented to students who left the school last year.

The Academy status recognises the high commitment the school places on developing leadership, especially Sports leadership within the school community.



Presentation Evening. Those present were treated to a superb and moving account of the team tactics which led to the GB team winning the Olympic 4x400 metre relay, against all odds. It was inspirational to hear Derek's account and made part of a very enjoyable evening where we celebrated out students' outstanding achievements.

We are very proud to be the first and only school in the country to have been awarded Sports Leadership Academy status in recognition of the opportunities we give our students for leadership and how well they excel in those roles. We are also pleased to have been presented with the prestigious White Rose Award for the work we have done on Pledge Against Prejudice. Again, this has been

recognised nationally and the Holocaust Trust chose Jack Hunt School students to go to Downing Street and meet the Prime Minister and Deputy Prime Minister. I am very grateful to all the staff and students who have worked so hard to be national leaders in these fields.

As we move through the year towards the Year 11 final exams I have been very impressed with the number of students attending Saturday Schools and the amount of time staff are giving up to run them. They have been taking place every Saturday since October and if your child is invited to attend one, please ensure that they take up the opportunity of improving their grades. Last year we focused on the core subjects but this year all subjects have the opportunity to bring students in for extra classes on a Saturday should they wish to do so. As we move towards the half term holiday could I ask parents of students in examination years to

gently remind their children of those allimportant revision timetables for the week. Our second visit from the Gold Apple School was extremely successful and I would like to thank all the parents who hosted the Chinese students. I know how excited our students are about their trip to China after Easter.

We have also been extremely saddened this term by the sudden illness of our Senior Laboratory Technician, Elizabeth Halley who passed away in January. Elizabeth had given 20 years excellent service to the school and will be much missed for her calm, efficient and supportive nature by the staff. The first Safer Schools Officer to work in the school, Karen Patterson, was involved in a fatal car crash in January. She is well remembered for the professionalism, sensitivity and great sense of humour she brought to the role. Both families are in our thoughts at this extremely difficult time.

PLEDGE AGAINST PREJUDICE: UPDATE



Holocaust Survivor Testimony

In October, Zigi Shipper returned to speak to our Year 10 students about his experiences of the holocaust. Zigi is a holocaust survivor who works with the Holocaust Educational Trust, travelling all over the country to share his testimony with young people.

Zigi's message is a powerful one: we must remain open minded about people who are different to ourselves, greeting with them tolerance and a desire for understanding, if we are to avoid repeating the mistakes of the past.

Zigi's deeply moving and powerful testimony prompted many questions from the Year 10 students, many of whom stayed beyond the end of the assembly to meet Zigi in person and have a photograph taken with him.





On 18 November, Jonathan McQuitty from the Aegis Trust visited the school to thank students for raising over £800 to support the work of the charity in campaigning against crimes against humanity.

Jonathan spoke to Year 9 students about his experiences in Rwanda and presented Aegis' prestigious White Rose Award in recognition of all the hard work in the Pledge Against Prejudice. Jonathan said: "It was great to come and meet with the Year 9 group, and the Pledge Against Prejudice team, to explain how the funds are used preventing genocide and crimes against humanity, making a real difference to people's lives in Rwanda particularly through education. Finding out more about how the student team, currently led by Georgia and Lucy, have taken responsibility for the initiative was inspiring, as are their plans for its future."
