

## MEMBERS OF THE PETERBOROUGH KEYS ACADEMIES TRUST:

Mrs Penelope Walkinshaw DL is a Deputy Lieutenant of Cambridgeshire and was High Sheriff of Cambridgeshire in 2012. She read Politics and French at Sussex University and founded her first business, 'Born to Spend', in the 1980s whilst working in the cultural travel business. In 1990 Penny, an experienced artist-enameller, founded and built up 'Chelsea Enamels', which specialised in bespoke hand painted enamel boxes. In 2007 Penny was invited by Mallett, the pre-eminent Bond Street antiques dealer, to project manage Madebymeta, their ground-breaking contemporary collection where 21st century Design meets 18th century Craft. She has lectured to Sotheby's Institute of Art's MA Course on Contemporary Art. Penny is a trustee of the East Anglian Air Ambulance, Wisbech and Fenland Museum, the Shrievalty Trust, Swaffham Prior Community Land Trust and a local RDA group. She is a Council Member of Ely Cathedral's Order of St Etheldreda, is involved in a number of local charities and was a school governor.

Matt Edwards has 20 years' experience in the Water and Environment sector working primarily for Water Utilities, engineering consultancies and contractors. He has worked in a range of industry roles from construction design and build, operations, asset management, supply chain management, R&D / Innovation, and engineering and change programme management. Matt's current role is Anglian Waters' Senior Manager responsible for asset maintenance, asset information, analytics and data science. He is a post graduate process engineer and scientist, an accredited programme and project manager, a Chartered Member of the Institute of Water & Environmental Management, an external lecturer at Cranfield University and Imperial College London, and an Anglian Water member representative for the Institute of Asset Management.
