As part of Peterborough's Power Down Fortnight in November, students from across the city gathered at Ken Stimpson Community School to compete in the Power Down Business Challenge. The

Dragon's Den style task was simple yet demanding: to invent, design and promote a product for Peterborough that would reduce carbon emissions and create a greener city. Our young eco-entrepreneurs got straight to work on their design for the portable wind turbine. An ingenious device that could be attached to bicycle handles, a baby's pushchair or even the roof of a car. The movement of the vehicle would charge a battery no matter the weather; wind not necessary. This could then be used to charge a mobile phone, MP3 player or hand held games console; ideal if you're away from a mains power supply. However, it wasn't just the design that impressed the formidable judges, it was also the fantastic presentation that the Jack Hunt students gave that made them stand out from the crowd. They performed a dramatic scene showing how the "Easy Energy" wind turbine could be a vital product for any Peterborough resident. Alice Taylor, Seb Roberts, Jamie Scholes, Eleanor Mitchell, Josh Cassidy and Sarah Abbs were each awarded a £10 Queensgate voucher and a certificate as joint winners with the Ken Stimpson team.

JACK HUNT SCHOOL WELCOMES SURVIVOR FROM THE HOLOCAUST EDUCATIONAL TRUST

On Thursday 11 October, the school welcomed Eva Clarke to talk to Year 10 students about her experiences of the Holocaust. Eva is a holocaust survivor who works with the Holocaust Educational Trust, travelling all over the country to share her testimony with young people.

Eva's account of being born in a concentration camp was deeply moving and shocking. The message that came through was a powerful one: we must be vigilant against prejudice and remain open minded about people who are different to ourselves. We must live with tolerance and a desire for understanding if we are to avoid repeating the mistakes of the past.

Eva's powerful testimony left many students appalled and indignant that civilised human beings could do this to people living within their own communities. Some Year 10s who had not previously signed up to the Pledge Against Prejudice did so immediately after the event, purchasing Pledge pins to further our fund raising efforts for The Aegis Trust and their work to overcome prejudice through education programmes in places as far afield as Rwanda in Africa.

The school would like to thank the Holocaust Educational Trust for the privilege of hearing Eva's testimony. This is the fourth year our Year 10 students have had the honour of meeting a holocaust survivor and hearing first hand testimony of this tragic period of history. In previous years, we have hosted Zigi Shipper and it was an honour to welcome Eva Clarke for the first time. We are very grateful to the Holocaust Educational Trust for co-ordinating the visit and we hope that by listening to Eva's testimony, students will reflect on the lessons of the Holocaust and make a positive difference in their own lives.

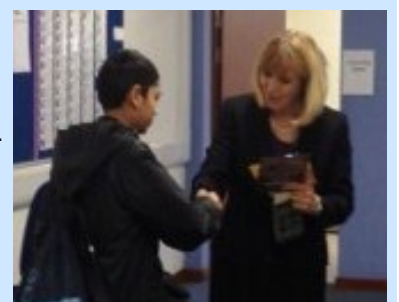

This will be reinvested for future activities that TIC want to organise for the younger students throughout the year.

Our anti-bullying ethos is continual at Jack Hunt and we take great pride in ensuring that we continue our work on this subject year round and not just for the official Anti-Bullying Week.
