



One award winner Elliot Jarvis summed up his two weeks with "Work experience has taught me the importance of observation, forward thinking and common sense. I would definitely recommend doing work experience – it was a brilliant thing to do. It has encouraged me to want to set up my own business. Before I went to WEX I never had correct equipment or kit for school and I wasn't bothered – now I see the point of school. I always try to bring the correct equipment and I really want to do well." Communication Leaders Assist Leeds Schools on Raising Literacy Profile

On Friday 27 June, eight Communication Leaders from Jack Hunt School visited the City of Leeds School to begin working with both Leeds East

and Leeds West Academies on a joint project aimed at raising the profile of literacy across all three institutions. Evie Scarborough, Oliver Oakley, Safwan Rija, Sophie Foreman, Peter Whyman, Jasmine Bowes, Francine Kelly and Jaiden Chavda spent the day working with students from both Leeds schools, designing new resources for all our classrooms and training them to observe lessons and offer feedback to staff. In addition, we were joined by Caroline Bligh, Senior Lecturer in Education and Childhood from Leeds Metropolitan University, who ran a session exploring how bilingual learners might benefit from having Communication Leaders to help them in school.

Communication Leaders are students who are trained to co-plan and observe lessons, offer feedback to teachers undertake research tasks, marking scrutinies and developing new resources in school. We hope to extend this work with our cluster primaries and are very excited at the prospect of working in another large

city and exploring how we can work together to improve learning and teaching across a number of schools. Watch this space!

Language & Culture Day Proves a Great Success
